CALCULUS FORMATION; REFERENCE GUIDE



1. Calculus Deposits Skill Level:

0	No sub Calculus	Light to moderate, supra-gingival grainy deposit NO sub-gingival deposit
I	Light Case	Light to moderate, supra & sub-gingival grainy deposit, small spicules At least 1 piece of sub-gingival deposit
II	Moderate Case	Moderate chunks of sub-gingival deposit in at least 3 segments, larger spicules Moderate tenacity Light to heavy supra-gingival deposit
III	Periodontal Maintenance Case	Light to moderate, sub-gingival sheeted deposit, spicules Light to moderate supra-gingival sheets, spicules
IV	Heavy	Heavy ledges, rings of tenacious sub-gingival deposit Light to moderate supra-gingival deposit Minimum of 20 teeth with 4 molars with Code 4 "kind of deposit"

2. Periodontal Skill Level:

	Probing Depths	Description
0	No pocket depths	No disease No radiographic changes Healthy, firm & pink tissue Excellent prognosis
I	Possible pseudopockets	Only the gingival tissue has been affected by the inflammatory process Slight bleeding & changes in form, color, Good prognosis
II	3-4mm pockets	Bleeding, changes in form, color, surface appearance Horizontal bone loss on radiographs Prognosis fair
III	Pocket depth 4-6 mm	Bleeding upon probing Furcation involvement Horizontal and vertical bone loss Prognosis guarded
IV	Pockets 6+mm	Bleeding, furcations, mobility Radiographic furcations, horizontal & vertical bone loss Prognosis is poor

Note: All three must be completed when the student completes scaling for the session.

Quad 1 = Upper right
 Quad 2 = Upper Left
 Quad 3 = Lower left
 Quad 4 = Lower right

Sextant 1 = Teeth 1 – 5
 Sextant 2 = Teeth 6 – 11
 Sextant 3 = Teeth 12 – 16
 Sextant 4 = Teeth 17 – 21
 Sextant 5 = Teeth 22 – 27
 Sextant 6 = Teeth 28 – 32
